GEORGIA HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Core courses include Mathematics, English/Language Arts, Science, Social Studies and Modern Language.
- Career, Technical, Agricultural Education (CTAE) designated courses may be used to meet the fourth science unit.
- Core area electives may include fine arts, CTAE, and/or modern language/Latin. <u>Two units of one</u> selected modern language/Latin are required of students with intentions to enter a <u>University System of Georgia institution</u>.
- Students are encouraged to choose electives that support their future academic and career goals.
- Students with disabilities will be eligible to earn a regular diploma by meeting the requirements outlined in the rule and in their Individualized Education Plan (IEP).
- Magnet/Academy programs may require more credits.

GRADUATION AND GRADE PLACEMENT REQUIREMENTS

Students must:

- As a <u>9th grader</u>, earn <u>5 units</u> during the school year to advance to the 10th grade.
- As a <u>10th grader</u>, earn a total of <u>11 units</u> during the school year to advance to the 11th grade.
- As an <u>IIth grader</u>, earn a total of <u>I6 units</u> during the school year to advance to the I2th grade.
- As a 12th grader, earn a total of 23 units by the end of the school year in order to GRADUATE.

<u>Attendance</u>

In high school, attendance is taken each period. If a student misses more than 15 days in a class, she/he risks losing credit for that class.

All 8th grade students will participate in a classroom guidance session that will focus on high school graduation requirements, creating a pre-IGP, and discussing career pathway options.




Students may access GCIS via any device that connects to the internet. GCIS provides many resources that allow students to prepare for their future and gain exposure to different careers.


