Sixth Grade Students' Immunizations

Parents: Please note that all students entering the seventh grade are required to meet the following (unless he/she has a religious exemption):



- Have the required doses of Hepatitis B, Diphtheria, Teta-• nus and Pertussis, and Polio vaccines.
- Have two doses of Measles vaccine, two doses of Mumps • vaccine, and one dose of Rubella vaccine OR laboratory proof of immunity against Measles, Mumps or Rubella.
- Have two doses of Varicella (chicken pox) vaccine OR • documentation of disease or laboratory proof of immunity.
- Have one dose of Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis) • vaccine and one dose of MCV (meningococcal conjugate vaccine) for children born on or after 01/01/2002.

Your child will NOT be able to enter the seventh grade without this documentation. The vaccines and appropriate form are both available at your healthcare provider's office and the Columbus Health Department.

Please make sure your child has received all appropriate vaccinations prior to the start of school (August 10, 2020).
