What is it?

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the Parent and Family Engagement Policy is included in the student handbook given out to all students. As a reminder, G.W. Parents can also receive a copy of the Parent and Family Engagement Policy in the Parent Resource Room/Area, the front office of the school and from the school's website.

***PBIS/School Climate Goal:** During the 2017-2018 school year, our school will continue to implement Positive Behavioral Intervention and Support (PBIS) by implementing 8 out of 10 of the PBIS modules with fidelity as measured by the three tiered fidelity inventory.*

***Academic/Instructional Goal:** During the 2017-2018 school year, 80% of teachers will implement level 3 and/or 4 of Marzano's Depth of Knowledge instructional strategies with fidelity by May 2018.*

What is a School-Parent Compacts?

As part of the Parent and Family Engagement Policy, G.W. Carver High School and our families will develop a School-Parent Compact. A School-Parent Compact for Achievement is an agreement that parents, students, and teachers develop together.
