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What is Title I?

Dawson Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is a federal grant that was designed to ensure that all children receive a high quality education and reach grade level proficiency. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parent and family engagement.

District Goals

For all students who reside in residential facilities served by the Muscogee County School District, parent and family engagement correspondence and activities information will be mailed to each facility where students reside.

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What is a School-Parent Compact?

As part of the Parental Involvement Policy, Dawson Elementary School and our families will develop a School-Parent Compact. A School-Parent Compact for Student Achievement is an agreement that parents, students, and teachers develop together. It explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. School Measures to Provide Required Assistance
