SIP Goal #1 – FY19

- Goal: By May 2019, 100% of teachers will be trained on student goal setting with 80% of the teachers implementing the strategy effectively in their instruction.
- **Goal met/not met:** Met
- Why/why not? Ongoing evidence of implementation
- Supporting data: Grade Level Documentation, samples of implemented strategies, data notebooks

SIP Goal #2 – FY19

- Goal: By May 2019, 100% of the staff will be fully trained on how to engage parents in an informal setting with 80% of the staff implementing these strategies effectively with all stakeholders.
- **Goal met/not met:** Met
- Why/why not? Grade level and school-wide activities held and well attended
- Supporting data: Staff participation in action strategies, parents and families attended events, grade levels hosted events in addition to school-wide events

PL Day #1 – FY19

- Focus: Student Goal Setting, Committee Selection, Engaging Families Refresher/Training
- Implementation effective? Yes
- Why/why not? Teacher observations and conversations showed more knowledge and confidence in the student goal setting process. Grade levels and school-wide family engagement activities were planned and well attended by families and community stakeholders.
 - **Supporting Data:** PLC meetings, grade level meetings, classroom observations, sign-in sheets for school-wide activities

PL Day #2 – FY19

- Focus: Student Goal Setting, Student Led Conferences, Set dates for Family Engagement Activities
- Was a change made from the original plan? Yes, we did not include student led conferences as we did not feel we were far enough along in the student goal setting process to push forward.
- Implementation effective? Student Goal Setting: Yes. Student Led Conferences: No, not implemented at this time.
- Why/why not? Teachers and students gained confidence in their knowledge and use of the goal setting process; however, student led conferences will continue to be our end goal.
 - Supporting Data: Student data notebooks, teacher data notebooks, teacher discussion/feedback

PL Day #3 – FY19

- Focus: Assessing student writing using rubrics/cross grade level
- **Was a change made from the original plan?** No
- **Implementation effective? Yes.**
- Why/why not? Grade level and cross grade level conversations, documentation and common rubrics showed progress in the writing process.
- Supporting Data: GMAS (Extended Writing Response), pre/post school-wide writing prompts

Overarching Needs

- 1. Routine for Conferring and Feedback in Writing
- 2. Increase the number of proficient writers on GMAS (extended writing).
- 3. Family Engagement
- 4. Writing Resources (Explicit Rubrics)

FY20 Instructional Goal

By May 2020, 100% of our teachers will participate in continued professional learning on student goal setting with 80% of the teachers implementing the strategy effectively in their writing instruction as measured by genre specific rubrics.

Instructional Goal: Action Steps

- Teachers will develop and implement effective systems for tracking and documenting individual student goals and progress in writing. Students will monitor and document their own progress.
- Teachers will consistently guide students to self assess their writing using kid-friendly grade level rubrics.

FY20 Climate Goal

By May 2020, two (2) of the Tier 1 critical elements of School-Wide Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) will be partially implemented to at least 80% fidelity based on the Tiered Fidelity Inventory (TFI) score (or Self Assessment (SAS) Survey score).

Climate Goal: Action Steps

Form a PBIS team for the school, set school-wide behavior expectations (Matrix), and create lessons to teach the expectations to students.

Create and implement a school-wide positive incentive program.
