ECMA HOUSEKEEPING NOTES

- Student <u>Drop Off is at 8am</u> and students should be <u>Picked up on later than 4:30pm</u>. Students found on campus before or after the specified times will receive a consequence if not under the direct supervision of a teacher/coach. Parents assume responsibility for any risk to student safety should they be on campus outside of the specified times.
- Students cannot be checked out of school after 3:30pm unless the student has a doctor's appointment and an appointment card can be provided.
- Lockers are required for all students the cost is \$7.00 and can be purchased in their ILT class.
- NON-CLEAR book bags must be secured in the hallway locker beginning Monday, August 18th. Clear book bags will be allowed to travel with the student.
- Cell phones must be secured in the student hallway locker before 1st period and can be retrieved after 6th period.
 Cell phones that have been confiscated by a teacher or administrator must be picked up by a parent in the Main Office between 9am 3:30pm with no exception.

ECMA is a student uniform school. Sixth grade students wear light blue shirts daily, seventh grade students wear yellowish-gold shirts daily and eighth grade students wear white shirts daily. Students have the choice of khaki or navy blue bottoms. NAVY SHIRTS are NOT an ECMA approved color. NO HOODED JACKETS OR SWEATERS. Belts are required not optional. - Upcoming SPLOST Dr. David Lewis, MCSD Superintendent is seeking suggestions for building improvements to all MCSD schools which would include ECMA. There will be a SPLOST suggestion form available at the Title I Open house on September 4th for parents to submit suggestions for consideration.

- Students can request for a Schedule Change beginning Tuesday, August 20th. The only classes that will be considered for a change to their schedule are Connections classes. Students must continue their current schedule until they have been approved by administration and given a NEW SCHEDULE. NEW OPPORTUNITY FOR TWENTY 6TH GRADE & 7TH GRADE GIRLS

Girls Inc. is partnering with ECMA to inspire (20) 6th grade girls and (20) 7th grade girls daily during their ILT class beginning September 10th. Selected students were given an application on August 23rd and must return the application on August 26th. Girls participating in the seminars will be equipped to navigate gender, economic, and social barriers and grow up healthy, educated, and independent. Girls, Inc. programs have positive outcomes that are achieved through three core elements: people - trained staff and volunteers who build lasting, mentoring relationships; environment - girls-only, physically and emotionally safe, where there is a sisterhood of support, high expectations, and mutual respect; and programming - research-based, hands-on and minds-on, age-appropriate, meeting the needs of today's girls.

• Did you know that an on grade level or higher Lexile score is beneficial to overall academic performance? Do you know your child's Lexile score? Historically East Columbus Magnet Academy has the highest average Lexile (Reading) growth of all MCSD middle and high schools in the past year for Achieve3000? We did not do it alone; we were fortunate to have had some awesome parents supporting literacy at ECMA! Thank you! We greatly appreciate you supporting this expectation and monitoring the student progress toward this goal. As a bonus we have monthly contest where students from each grade level win prizes such as gifts cards to IHOP, Butterball turkey at Thanksgiving, Ham at Christmas, and catered breakfast from IHOP during 1st period. Last week, your child took the Level Set assessment in Achieve3000 to determine their Lexile level. Be sure to talk with your child about their Lexile score and the goal of passing 3 Achieve3000 articles a week. Lastly, students that meet the aforementioned expectation and increase their Lexile score will participate in our Annual Lexile Luau in May.
