



 What are your thoughts on the 8 traits that Richard St. John identifies as those that lead to success?

# Three Strands of CAS

Creativity

Activity
Service



### Creativity

Creativity is exploring and extending ideas leading to an original or interpretive product of performance.



# Activity

Activity is physical exertion contributing to a healthy lifestyle.



# Service

Service is collaborative and reciprocal engagement with the community in response to an authentic need.





### CAS Experiences

A CAS experience is a specific event in which the student engages with one or more of the three CAS strands. Additionally, it MUST:

- Be based on personal interest, skill, talent, or opportunity for growth
- Provide opportunities to develop the attributes of the IB learner profile & meet learner outcomes
- Not be used or included in the student's Diploma/Career or graduation requirements.









Demonstrates the skills and recognize the benefits of working collaboratively.






Recognize and consider the ethics of choices and actions.



### Consider the following

- Will the experience be enjoyable?
- Does the experience allow for development of personal interests, skills, and/or talent?
- What might be the possible consequences of your CAS experience for you, others, and the environment?
- Which CAS learning outcome(s) may be addressed?

### Nuts & Bolts of CAS/CSL

- You MUST be involved in CAS activities WEEKLY for 18 months...INCLUDING BREAKS
- What should you be doing "weekly?"
- Engage in things you will enjoy!
- Engage in ALL 3 strands
- Target the 7 Learner Outcomes

### Nuts & Bolts of CAS/CSL

- Reflect use the form for now...more instruction/guidance later
- · Collect "artifacts"
- Complete a Supervisor Evaluation Form at the end of each experience
- Maintain an organized "portfolio" do your best for now...more guidance later
- Complete collaborative service project WAIT ON THIS

### Where do I start?
