# What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Hardaway High School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Hardaway High School values the contributions and engagement of families to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Hardaway High School will support family engagement and how families can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

# How is it revised?

Hardaway High School will invite all parents to attend our annual Policies meeting to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact and the parent and family engagement budget. The plan will be posted on our school web site for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. We also will distribute an annual survey online and by mail to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year including our annual Policies meeting.

## Who is it for?

All students and their families participating in the Title I program are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Hardaway High School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children.

# Where is it available?

At the beginning of the next school year, the plan will be included in the student handbook that is given to all students. We will also have the plan available to all parents in August on registration day before the scheduled Open House event. After revision, the plan will be posted on the school website. Parents can retrieve a copy of the plan in the main office and in the Family Resource Area. For all students who reside in residential facilities served by the Muscogee County School District, family engagement correspondence and activities information will be mailed to each facility where students reside.

Parents will be celebrated and able to participate in various educational activities. Parents will learn what community resources are available.

Gain knowledge on various information pertaining to school climate and instructional smart goals.

#### Community Cares Fair – March

Connect with the school and community to build a better school and review school plans. Roundtable discussions with the principal, staff, students, and parents regarding the schoolwide plan, Parent and Family Engagement policy, School-Parent compact and the parental involvement budget.
