District Goals

By July 2023, the Muscogee County School District will implement a Leadership Development Program, Personalized Learning, and a Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) with a "Culture of Kindness".

Hawk's Smart Goals

By May 2021, 100% of teachers will be trained on Georgia's Multi-Tiered System of Supports for improving student achievement and behavior with 85% showing successful implementation.

By May 2022, 90% of teachers will increase student participation through the implementation of the components of International Baccalaureate (IBO's) Middle Years Program and personalized learning.

WHAT IS TITLE I?

Hardaway High School is identified as a Title I school as part of Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is a federal grant that was designed to ensure that all children receive a high quality education and reach grade level proficiency.

Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parent and family engagement.

School Measures to Provide Required Assistance

- Ensure all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and activities are published in both English and Spanish (if needed), posted on the school's website, Virtual meetings, ConnectEd, flyers, REMIND 101, Canvas and posted on school's marquee.
- Conduct staff development on parent involvement practices and effective strategies for staff to communicate and build partnerships with parents.
