# What is Title I?

# **School Plan for Shared Student Achievement**

## What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Kendrick High School will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. Kendrick High School values the contributions and engagement of parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Kendrick High School will support parent engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

# How is it revised?

Kendrick High School invited all parents to attend our annual School Forum last spring to review and revise this parental engagement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact and the parental engagement budget. The plan is posted on our school Web site for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and by mail to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for parental engagement. Parents can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year including our annual Community Cares event.

## Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Kendrick High School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children.

# Where is it available?

At the beginning of the next year, the plan will be included in the student handbook that is given to all students. As a reminder, we will have the plan available to all parents in August during registration day before the scheduled Open House event. The plan will also be posted on the school Web site. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the main office and Parent Resource Room. For all students who reside in residential facilities served by the Muscogee County School District, parental engagement correspondence and activities information will be mailed to each facility where students reside.
