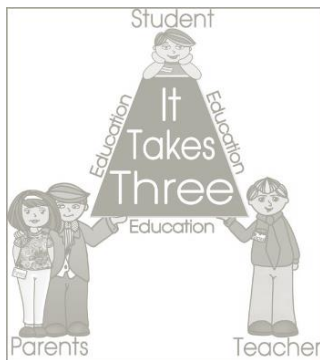


What is a School-Parent Compact?

Effective School-Parent Compacts:

- Link to goals of the School Improvement Plan
- Focus on student learning skills
- Describe how teachers will help students develop those skills using high-quality instruction
- Share strategies parents can use at home
- Explain how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress
- Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe and participate in the classroom

District Goals

School's Smart Goals

Smart Goal 1: By May 2021, 100% of teachers will have trained their students on how to utilize their SMART goals with 80% implementing strategies to teach students to engage in effective dialogue that reveals active monitoring of their own progress as measured by peer to peer, student to teacher and student to parent conferencing.

Smart Goal 2: By May 2021, 100% of the staff will be trained with 80% effectively using established schoolwide communication systems and PBIS classroom rules/routines to foster positive staff relationships, improve student attendance and increase student achievement as measured by community and school wide surveys.
