

Freshmen Students and Parents

As we prepare our students for college and careers, the high school curriculum is designed to be more rigorous. It is a common part of the freshman transition for students to be surprised, and sometimes overwhelmed, by the amount of work necessary to achieve the grades they have been accustomed to getting. In order to assist your child in adjusting to these increased expectations, you might want to suggest, and support them doing some of the following:

- Break larger assignments into smaller increments
- Take complete and well organized notes
- Create flashcards for studying and reviewing
- Ask your teachers for help before or after school
- Form a study group of classmates.
- Consult a knowledgeable upperclassman for help with material or study skills.
- Ask your teacher for a content specific website for help
- Reduce distractions when working, as much as possible.
