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Building Partnerships

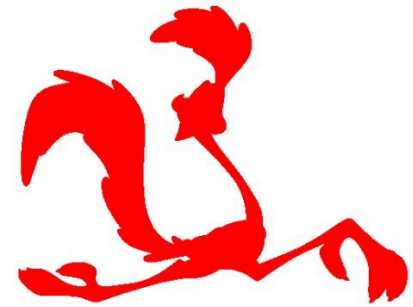
- Parents are invited to attend monthly parent workshops and activities sponsored by the school.

Our Goals for 2018 – 2019

- **Goal #1** By May 2019, five (5) out of the ten (10) Tier 1 critical elements of School-Wide Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) will be at least partially implemented with three (3) of the five (5) elements developed to at least 85% fidelity based on the Tiered Fidelity **Inventory (TFI) score (or Self-Assessment (SAS) Survey score)**.
- **Goal #2** By May 2019, 100% of teachers will implement concept mapping and utilize teacher/peer collaboration in their learning and classroom practices with 85% fidelity.

Goal #1 Action Plan:

Action Plan

- Continue to implement the “7 Habits of Highly Effective People” by teaching and modeling weekly strategies and skills using The Leader in Me Grade Level Activity Guides.
- Present a Book-of-the-Month with an emphasis on the individual “7 Habits of Highly Effective People,” using the Book-of-the-Month to guide The Leader in Me activities, discussion and student writing.
- Participate in the book study Teaching With Poverty in Mind, by Eric Jensen.
- Participate in the book study Teacher 50, by Principal Kafele.
- Implement PBIS.

Prioritized Needs

- Establish a positive culture of leadership for our students by applying the principles of “The Leader in Me” and a school wide behavior policy in order for our students to take more ownership of their behavior and academic learning.

Goal #2 Action Plan:

Action Plan

- Utilize teacher/peer collaboration for our students to develop a deep understanding of what they have learned through grade level standards.
- Implement concept mapping and interactive notebooks in all subject areas.
- Utilize the intervention teachers to meet the needs of all learners.
- Utilize Achieve 3000 and Smarty Ants.
- Conduct weekly data team and collaborative planning meetings as well as cross grade level meetings every nine weeks.
- Distribute parent newsletter incorporating research-based strategies for reading and emphasize the importance of reading daily.

- Improve student achievement using research-based strategies through concept mapping and teacher peer collaboration as measured by walkthroughs for teacher implementation.
