

Theatre Technology & Acting Classes

- Theatre Technology classes are hands on classes that teach how to design, build and paint scenery, design and build costumes, design makeup effects, and use lighting and sound equipment. If you want to be behind the scenes and making the magic, this is the class for you!
- Acting classes are theatre production classes that require an acting production in front of a live audience. If you were born for the stage, this class is for you! Class covers acting techniques, character makeup, resume writing and headshots, and auditioning techniques.







BEGINNING WOMEN'S CHORUS 1 Ms. Dooley, Choral Director

BEGINNING PIANO CLASS

Beginning Piano Class 1 (53.09410)

- This class is for students that have had little or no piano experience.
- Students will learn basic piano skills, music theory, and musicianship.
- **¹ Students will compose music.**

Beginning Piano Class 2 (53.09420) – Piano Class 1 is a prerequisite.

- This class is for students who have passed Piano Class 1.
- **♪** Students will continue to learn late beginner piano skills, theory, and musicianship.
- **♪** Students will compose music.

INTERMEDIATE PIANO CLASS

Ms. Dooley, Piano Instructor

Intermediate Piano Class 1 (53.09510)

- **▶** Pre-requisite: Beginning Piano 2 or Teachers Approval
- Students will work on intermediate piano skills, music theory, musicianship, and compose music.

Intermediate Piano Class 2 (53.09520)

- ♪ Pre-requisite: Intermediate Piano 1 or Teachers Approval
- Students will work on late intermediate piano skills, music theory, musicianship, and compose music.

ALL PIANO CLASSES – Each student will strive to develop confidence and skills to practice independently and develop an appreciation of recreational piano playing.

Visual Arts Comprehensive

Visual Arts 1 – Students will learn the very basics needed to create visually appealing art.
DRAWING, using basic media such as: pencil, color pencil, marker and crayon, is the main source of our art making throughout the year. We will explore other mediums at times, but we will do some version of drawing for EVERY project.

Visual Arts 2 – Students begin to hone in and practice Drawing technique. Upper level classes are designed for the artist who wants to explore different processes of creating and get better at drawing.


All ART classes are taken consecutively and must be passed to move on.



INTERMEDIATE BAND IS OPEN TO STUDENTS IN 9-12 AT SHAW HIGH SCHOOL THAT HAVE PREVIOUSLY PARTICIPATED IN A MUSICAL ENSEMBLE IN MIDDLE SCHOOL. STUDENTS IN INTERMEDIATE BAND WILL TYPICALLY PERFORM IN TWO CONCERTS PER SCHOOL YEAR.

INTERMEDIATE BAND STUDENTS OFTEN CONTINUE TO THE ADVANCED BAND

ADVANCED BAND IS OPEN TO STUDENTS IN GRADES 9-12 AT SHAW HIGH SCHOOL WHO SHOW A HEIGHTENED UNDERSTANDING OF THEIR INSTRUMENT. STUDENTS IN ADVANCED BAND WILL PERFORM IN AT LEAST FOUR CONCERTS PER YEAR AND REPRESENT SHAW IN THE ANNUAL LARGE GROUP PERFORMANCE EVALUATION.




Mythology

- This course introduces the importance of myths and tales of classical mythology, focusing on a comparative study of plot, characters, themes, and figurative devices.
- The course emphasizes the following: critical and analytical skills, vocabulary development, a study of the influences of Greek, Roman, and Norse word origins on the English language, and composition.
- The study of the relationship between people and their societies is a major emphasis, along with the impact of mythology on the literary world.
- Writing exploration through media literacy and viewing will be a focus in this course.


SAT/ACT Prep
