COLUMBUS, Georgia – June 1 – August 31, 2016. This summer, thousands of Muscogee County students can relish their independence with METRA Transit System's **SUMMER FUN CONNECTION!** For only a few cents a trip, the **SUMMER FUN PASS** gives students (ages 9 to 18) unlimited rides on any local METRA route and access to several exciting destinations! This means students no longer have to depend on mom and dad for transportation to the movies, mall or Uptown!

Non-school hours are peak time for juvenile crime and risky behaviors like alcohol and drug use. METRA will help reverse this trend by eliminating the transportation barrier and keeping students involved in positive activities during the summer. Students can ride METRA bus routes to more than a dozen key locations in Columbus like, the Hollywood Connection, the Coca-Cola Space Science Center, the National Infantry Museum and the Columbus Public Libraries! Kids ages 9-18 can also travel to other sites around town on any of our regular route buses.

The "**Summer Fun Connection**" begins June 1 and continues through August 31, 2016. Student's ages 9 to 18 can participate in the program, but an adult must accompany kids under age 12.
