Mrs. Howard promoted the mission of Historic Columbus for many years as a volunteer and employee of the organization. It was her wish that the scholarship be awarded based on merit and need. It will also be provided directly to the recipient for the use to purchase items associated with attending a university or college.

The requirements for scholarship consideration are:

- A graduating senior from a public school in Muscogee County;
- A completed application by the deadline;
- A copy of the student's transcript;
- A copy of the Student Aid Report (SAR);
- A completed essay on the topic provided
- A letter of recommendation; and
- A photo of yourself in front of the building holding a "This Place Matter" sign.

Each essay must be: Minimum of 500 words, Maximum- 1,000 words Times New Roman, 12 pt. font Double Spaced One-inch margins SCORING: Scoring by the Historic Columbus Scholarship Committee will be based on five criteria - Originality; Overall interest; Contents; Merit; and Need.

Historic Columbus reserves the right to not award winners in certain categories if the essays submitted do not warrant winning status.
