August is the month filled with Diagnostic Testing:::

Diagnostic testing is a form of assessment that occurs before instruction begins.

The purpose of administering diagnostic tests is to try to determine what students already know about the concepts and skills to be covered by instruction. The tests determine the type of differentiated instruction needed, and discover students' preferred learning styles as well as their strengths, weaknesses, and misconceptions.

Diagnostic tests are intended to closely follow what will be asked on the Benchmark assessments and can be used to predict how well students will perform on the Georgia Milestones. Parents please encourage your child to perform their absolute best on these assessments.

Skillstreaming employs a four-part training approach modeling, role-playing, performance feedback, and generalization. 
