"The School Climate Star Rating is a diagnostic tool to determine if a school is on the right path to school improvement," the GaDOE says on its website. The rating is based on data from surveys of students, employees and parents, as well as attendance for students and employees and student discipline records which measure school safety.

College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI)

The CCRPI is Georgia's statewide measure of how well schools are performing academically in the areas of content mastery, progress, closing the gap, and readiness. Wynnton's score of 76.9 reflected a double-digit increase of 13.2 and was higher than the state and the district averages, placing us #9 in MCSD for elementary schools.
