



Agriculture Program Guide

The Agriculture industry includes enterprises engaged in growing crops, raising fish and animals, logging wood, and developing renewable energy sources. This program teaches students about a wide variety of skills, including science, math, communications, leadership, management and technology. Georgia's agricultural industry plays a significant role in the state's economy, contributing billions of dollars annually. About one in seven Georgians are employed in Agriculture.

High Schools

By participating in high school CTAE programs, students can create opportunities to continue their studies in college, pursue an entry-level job, or serve in a related field in the military. (See back for a full list of programs.)

FFA

FFA is the Career & Technical Student Organization (CTSO) that gives students an opportunity to participate in career-related competitions across the state and nation, and gain leadership experience.

Certifications

After completing a CTAE pathway, students prepare for Precision and NOCTI certification exams, at CTAE expense, that may qualify them for entry-level jobs and/or college credit.

Work-Based Learning

Students have the opportunity to be released early from school to work in positions related to their CTAE pathways.

Direct-to-Work

Rigorous high school programs prepare students for agriculture careers upon graduation.
