Students in this area of study will learn the basic skills needed to gain employment as an entry level automotive technician. Various Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) student certifications are attainable upon completion of these courses. The mechanical skills taught in this program can be used in a number of other occupations.



Start In High School. Follow *Your* Perfect Path.

High Schools

By participating in high school CTAE programs, students can create opportunities to continue their studies in college, pursue an entry-level job, or serve in a related field in the military. (See back for a full list of programs.)

SkillsUSA

SkillsUSA is the Career & Technical Student Organization (CTSO) that gives students an opportunity to participate in career-related competitions across the state and nation, and gain leadership experience.

Certifications

After completing a CTAE pathway, students prepare for certification exams, at CTAE expense, that may qualify them for entry-level jobs and/or college credit. Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) certifications are currently offered for brakes and for maintenance and light repair.

Work-Based Learning

Students have the opportunity to be released early from school to work in positions related to their CTAE pathways.

Direct-to-Work

Rigorous high school programs prepare students for automotive repair careers upon graduation.
