Start In High School. Follow *Your* Perfect Path.

High Schools

By participating in high school CTAE programs, students can create opportunities to continue their studies in college, pursue an entry-level job, or serve in a related field in the military. (See back for a full list of programs.)

FBLA

Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) is the Career & Technical Student Organization (CTSO) that gives students an opportunity to compete in career-related events and gain leadership experience.

Certifications

After completing a CTAE pathway, students prepare for NOCTI certification exams, at CTAE expense, that may qualify them for entry-level jobs and/or three hours of college credit, such as Basic Accounting, Advanced Accounting, and Financial Investment Planning.

Work-Based Learning

Students have the opportunity to be released early from school to work in positions related to their CTAE pathways.

Direct-to-Work

Rigorous high school programs prepare students for careers in finance upon graduation.
