Students will also develop an understanding of liability and human resource issues as they relate to lodging, travel and recreational event planning. Upon successful completion of the program, students may earn three hours of college credit in the areas of either Hospitality Management, Lodging, or Travel & Tourism. *(Shaw)*

Culinary Arts: In this program, students prepare to enter at the postsecondary level or enter the food-service industry as a proficient and well-rounded individual. Strong importance is given to refining hands-on production of the classic fundamentals in the commercial kitchen. *(Jordan)*
