High Schools

SkillsUSA

SkillsUSA is the Career & Technical Student Organization (CTSO) that gives students an opportunity to participate in career-related competitions across the state and nation, and gain leadership experience.

Certifications

After completing a CTAE pathway, students prepare for certification exams, at CTAE expense, that may qualify them for entry-level jobs and/or college credit. Certifications in Adobe Premiere, Adobe Photoshop, and Adobe Illustrator are available depending upon the chosen pathway.

Work-Based Learning
