

# GMAS TEST DESIGN

- Students are allowed up to the maximum testing time to complete the assessment.
- Examiners must adhere to the testing times prescribed in the Test Administration Manuals and scripts.
  - Allowing too much or too little time may result in an invalidation.

#### Calculator Policy

All grades 6-high school — test takers should be trained in the use of the online Desmos Calculator embedded in the practice tests

### HOW IS PERFORMANCE REPORTED?

A student's performance on each section of Georgia Milestones will be reported using four achievement levels: Beginning Learner, Developing Learner, Proficient Learner and Distinguished Learner.

**Beginning Learners** are students that will require a significant amount of support from home and school to be successful in the next grade level.

**Developing Learners** have shown partial mastery of their grade level's standards but will need some additional home and schools support to be successful in the next grade level.

Proficient Learners have strongly shown their mastery of their grade level's standards and are ready to move up to the next grade level.

**Distinguished Learners** have shown mastery beyond their grade level indicating readiness for advanced coursework.

### WHAT CAN YOU DO?

GMAS scores from 2024-2025 will determine what class your 6th or 7th grader will be enrolled in next year.
