What is GaTAPP?

Non-traditional pathway approved by the GaPSC to earn GA teacher certification

Candidate has the subject knowledge and the program trains them how to be a teacher

Job embedded (teach full-time while in the program)

Hybrid education model (combination of in-person and online)
