WHAT IS PBIS?

PBIS stands for Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports. Georgetown uses PBIS schoolwide to teach, practice, recognize, and support positive behavior.

Students are expected to be
READY. RESPECTFUL. RESPONSIBLE.



JAGUAR POINTS

Jaguar Points are Georgetown Elementary's schoolwide positive behavior rewards.

Students earn Jaguar Points when they show the three expectations: Ready, Respectful, and Responsible. This includes following directions, positive hallway behavior, completing classwork, returning homework, helping others, showing effort, and being a role model.

Students may use Jaguar Points for PBIS celebrations, special privileges, and items from the Jaguar Store!



WHAT DOES PBIS QUALIFIED MEAN?

A student is PBIS Qualified when they consistently follow the schoolwide expectations of being Ready, Respectful, and Responsible, show positive behavior and effort in class, have good attendance, and have no office referrals for the month.

Some PBIS events and celebrations require students to be PBIS Qualified. ♥

You play a vital role in your child's success! Take a few minutes each day to review the Ready, Respectful, Responsible expectations at home. Ask your child how they earned Jaguar Points and celebrate their positive choices together.

1 ARRIVAL & TARDIES

- Doors open and breakfast begins at 7:00 a.m.; breakfast ends at 7:40 a.m.
- Walkers, bus riders, and daycare drop-off use the front parking lot.
- Car riders use the car loop behind the school. Drop-off in the front lot or on High Lane is not permitted.
- Students must be in class by 7:45 a.m. or they are tardy.
- A parent/guardian must sign in tardy students in the office and get a tardy slip.
- Excessive tardiness may be referred to the school social worker or outside support agencies.



2 DISMISSAL & TRANSPORTATION

- Dismissal begins at 2:15 p.m.
- Bus loading takes priority. Pre-K–2 bus riders must have an adult at the stop or they will be returned to school.
- Walkers are released from the front door. Dre-K–2 walkers must be met at the Georgetown Drive side/crosswalk.
- Parents of walkers may not park on High Lane.
- Car riders are released in the rear car loop and must display the official vehicle pick-up tag.
- If a pick-up tag is not displayed, the authorized adult must park, enter the front office, and show ID.
- The after-school program operates from 2:30–6:00 p.m.; pick-up is at the cafeteria door in the back of the school. Contact the office for registration and fees.



3 DISMISSAL CHANGES & LATE PICK-UP

- Send dismissal changes to the teacher in writing and receive confirmation that the message was received.
- Verbal instructions sent through a student will not be accepted.
- Walker families should make a weather plan with the teacher in advance. Unless there is a severe weather alert, walkers will not be held due to rain.
- Students not picked up by 2:40 p.m. will be escorted to the office and a parent/guardian will be contacted.
- At 2:45 p.m., a student may be placed in the Georgetown after-school program and fees may apply.
- Chronic late pick-up may result in contact with DFCS or MCSD Police.



4 ATTENDANCE & CHECK-OUTS

- Students are expected to attend school on time every day. Poor attendance affects learning.
- Excused absences include personal illness, contagious conditions, death in the immediate family, state-recognized religious holidays, or government mandates.
- Submit absence documentation within 3 days. Parent notes may excuse up to 3 absences; after that, official documentation is required.
- All absences count. Five unexcused absences may result in referral to the social worker; 10 unexcused absences may place a student at risk of retention.
- Students have 3 days to make up missed work. Attendance recovery opportunities may be available.
- Only authorized adults may check out a student, and photo ID is required.
- Students who check in after 11:15 a.m. or check out before 11:15 a.m. are counted absent for the day.
- Early check-out ends at 1:30 p.m. Documentation is required to excuse early dismissal. Excessive unexcused early check-outs require a conference with the attendance team.

1 UNIFORM & DRESS CODE

- Uniforms are required Monday–Friday: navy-blue tops and khaki bottoms. Navy or khaki uniform dresses are also allowed.
- Students should maintain appropriate hygiene and follow the MCSD dress code.
- Shoes must be worn at all times. No flip-flops or thong sandals. Closed-toe shoes are best for PE; other shoes must secure the heel.
- Headgear may not be worn in the building unless approved for a special activity.
- No halters, spaghetti straps, see-through clothing, biker shorts, sagging bottoms, or bare midriffs. Shirts must have sleeves.
- For grades 3–5, shorts and skirts may be no shorter than 2 inches above the knee. Leggings/tights must be paired with a top, skirt, or shorts that reaches the knee.
- No holes, rips, or hanging strings are permitted on approved dress-out days. Students out of dress code may be required to change and may lose dress-out privileges.



2 PERSONAL ITEMS & ELECTRONICS

- Students are responsible for their book bags and the items inside them.
- Parents should check book bags regularly for assignments, notes, forms, and unnecessary items.
- Rolling book bags are not allowed.
- Cell phones and personal electronic devices are strictly prohibited.
- If seen by an adult, devices will be confiscated and kept in the office until a parent/guardian picks them up.
- Teachers and the school are not responsible for students' personal items.



3 VISITORS & CONFERENCES

- All visitors must dress appropriately and enter through the front office.
- Georgetown uses the Raptor Visitor Management System. A photo ID or driver's license is required for check-in.
- Visitors must keep their pass visible and remain only in the area designated on the pass.
- Campus visitation may be limited when safety precautions require it.
- Classroom observations should be prearranged with the teacher and limited to 15 minutes unless otherwise approved.
- Teachers may not leave class for unscheduled calls or conferences. Parent-teacher conferences should be scheduled during non-instructional time.
- Visitors must report back to the office to check out before leaving campus.



4 FAMILY REMINDERS

- Keep phone numbers, addresses, emergency contacts, and authorized pick-up information current.
- Read school and teacher messages regularly and return requested forms promptly.
- Review arrival, dismissal, attendance, uniforms, and electronics expectations with your child.
- Current working contact information is essential in the event of an emergency.

Uniform Guidelines

- ✓ Uniforms are worn daily unless administration has approved a dress-out day.
- ✓ Students must still follow the MCSD dress code on approved dress-out days.
- ✓ Students dressed out of code may be required to call home for appropriate clothing.
- ✓ Shirts should be tucked into pants, skirts, and shorts.
- ✓ Clothing with holes, short skirts, or short shorts is not permitted.
- ✓ Shoes must have a heel strap. Flip-flops, slides, and high heels are not permitted.
