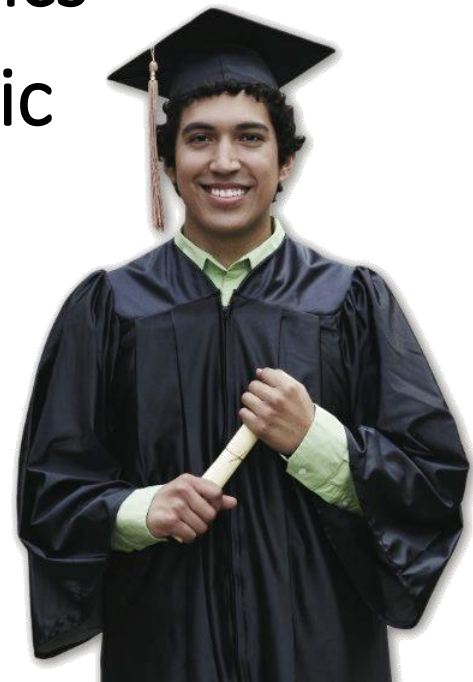

IBCP

Core:

- Personal & Professional Skills (PPS)
- Reflective Project (RP)
- Language Development (LD)
- Community and Service Learning (CAS)





- **Must study one course from each group (6 Diploma Courses)**
- **Must have 3 HL courses and 3 SL courses**
- **Must complete TOK**
- **Must complete EE**
- **Must complete CAS**



- **Must study 2 – 4 Diploma Courses**
- **No requirement on HL vs SL**
- **Must complete PPS**
- **Must complete RP**
- **Must complete CAS**
- **Must complete Language Development**
- **Must complete CTAE Pathway & pass end of pathway assessment**

IBCP vs. IBDP

Misconceptions...



- IBDP is harder than IBCP
- Universities do not value IBCP
- College credits are guaranteed in the IBDP
- You cannot get college credit if you choose IBCP
- IBDP allows you to enter college as a sophomore
- IBCP is only for those who are not college bound
- The IBCP Healthcare Pathway is the best fit for becoming a surgeon or doctor

IBCP vs. IBDP

Benefits...



- IBCP is a blend of college prep and career prep
- Some universities do offer scholarships for earning the IB Diploma (only for IBDP)
- The IBCP Core focuses heavily on skills valued in the international business community
- The IBDP Core focuses heavily on skills valued in academic settings
- Courses in both programs provide rigorous academic content and skills necessary for college
- Both programs focus on student self-development

Graduation Requirements

- 9th Grade Lit., American Lit, + 2 more literature courses
- Government(1/2 credit), US History, World History, Economics
- Physical Science; Biology; Chemistry, Earth Science, Environmental Science, or AP/IB science; + 1 more science credit
- Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, + 1 more math course
- Health & Personal Fitness
- 3 credits of CTAE, World Language, &/or Fine Arts (you must have two credits in the same world language to attend a 4 year university)
- 4 elective credits
- It is also suggested that you complete some pathway whether career, advanced academic, world language, or fine arts

Move on When Ready

- IB and MOWR/Dual Enrollment do NOT mix...
- You cannot complete the IB program requirements and Dual Enroll UNLESS it is designed as a part of completing your career pathway.
- While “free college” is very tempting, that is not the whole story
 - Selective University Admissions
 - Preparation for College demands
 - Self-Development
