# WHAT IS TITLE I?

- Title I is a federal grant that was designed to ensure that ALL children receive a high quality education and reach grade level proficiency.
- Programs funded by Title I have two major goals:
  - ✓ Student Achievement
  - ✓ Parent and Family Engagement

# HOW IS TITLE I MONEY SPENT?

- Staff development for the faculty
- Instructional materials and supplies
- Books for the media center and classroom libraries
- Additional computers/technology equipment
- Intervention Teachers
- Academic Coaches
- Parenting Specialists

# HOW DOES A SCHOOL PARTICIPATE IN THE TITLE I PROGRAM?

- The amount of Title I funding a school receives is contingent upon the school's free-reduced lunch calculation.
- These funds are used to upgrade the entire educational program to improve achievement for all students.
- Funds support extra instruction in reading and mathematics, after-school, and summer programs to extend and reinforce the regular school curriculum.

# WHAT ARE THE TITLE I REQUIREMENTS?

- A comprehensive needs assessment of the entire school.
- Schoolwide reform strategies that provide opportunities for all children to succeed.
- Instruction by teachers with professional qualifications (PQ).
- High-quality and ongoing professional development for all administrators and staff.
- Strategies to attract high-quality teachers.
- Strategies to increase parent engagement.

# WHAT ARE THE TITLE I REQUIREMENTS? (CONT.)

- Assisting students transitioning from Pre-K to Kindergarten, from elementary to middle, middle to high school, and high school to college.
- Measures to include teachers in the decisions regarding the use of academic assessments to improve student achievement.
- Activities to ensure that students who experience difficulty mastering the proficient or advanced levels of academic standards shall be provided with effective, timely additional assistance.
- Coordination and integration of Federal, State, and local services and programs.

# WHAT IS OUR SCHOOL'S DESIGNATION STATUS AND WHAT DOES THAT MEAN?

Our school has been designated as a Schoolwide Title I School.

**GEORGIA MILESTONES ASSESSMENT (GMAS).**

- The GMAS is a more rigorous test consisting of multiple-choice items, open-ended and constructed response items.

# WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT?

- Convene an annual meeting to inform parents of the school's participation under Title I.
- Notify parents of the curriculum being used, how student progress is measured, and the expectation of students to meet proficiency standards.
- Notify parents of the state assessments their children are expected to take, what they are expected to achieve, and the implications of assessment results.
- Inform parents of their opportunities to ask questions and to provide input on their child's education.

# PARENT 1% SET ASIDE FUNDS

- Each Title I school will receive Title I funds for parental engagement activities, including promoting family literacy and parenting.

- Parents of children receiving Title I services will be asked to complete a Parent survey. Decisions regarding how Parental funds are allotted for parental engagement activities and resources are based on the results of this survey.

# WHAT IS THE “PARENT’S RIGHT TO KNOW” LETTER?

Parents have the right to ask the school for and receive information on staff qualifications. You may ask:

- If the teacher is certified to teach the grade level to which they are currently assigned.
- If your child is provided services by a paraprofessional, and if so, what are their qualifications.
