Richards Middle School will provide all students with high quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment to meet high academic standards.

Academic Goal: By May 31, 2029, Richards Middle School will strengthen Tier 1 instruction by ensuring that 100% of teachers integrate Lexile appropriate texts and CTAE career pathway connections into instruction each grading period, with at least 90% of classrooms demonstrating evidence of literacy integration and career relevance as measured through walkthroughs and instructional artifacts.

Behavioral Goal: By May 31, 2029, Richards Middle School will improve student engagement, attendance, and behavior by integrating Georgia CTAE Essential soft Skills into its Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) framework, with 90% of classrooms demonstrating evidence of soft skills instruction and positive behavior practices as measured through walkthroughs and school climate data.

STRATEGIES FOR ENGAGING AND EMPOWERING FAMILIES

School Measures to Provide Required Assistance:

Richards Middle School will take the following measures to promote and support parents:

Curriculum Information: Inform parents throughout the year about what their child is learning by providing parent and family engagement meetings and workshops, parent-teacher conferences, information on Canvas, and on our school website.

Student Progress Monitoring: Ensure families are familiar with the online resource Infinite Campus (Parent Portal) that allows families to view grades, attendance, schedules, assessments, course history, and much more. Monitoring student progress in school is an important way to be involved in their education.

Parent Resources: Create and maintain a Parent Resource Area/Room to allow parents opportunities to check out materials to assist them with helping their child at home. Resources are available in English and Spanish.

Staff Trainings: Conduct staff development trainings on parent engagement practices and effective strategies for staff to communicate and build partnerships with parents.

Communication: Ensure schools publish all information related to school workshops, programs, meetings, and activities in both English and Spanish and communicated on a regular basis.

Transition Support: Partner with elementary schools, middle schools, high schools, college and career organizations, parent resource centers, or other programs (as applicable) to help prepare families and their children for successful school transitioning.
