



Dear Parent or Guardian,

Shaw High School is committed to providing academic opportunities for our students. We are offering a summer credit recovery program in **ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies and a limited number of electives** for students who have not passed a course in those subjects. Based on your child's academic performance over four nine weeks, his/her cumulative average is below a 70 and therefore he/she qualifies for Georgia Virtual Credit Recovery.

What is Georgia Virtual Credit Recovery?

- ✓ Credit Recovery courses are designed to be on a flexible schedule in which direct instruction is not provided, however, a content teacher is available to answer content related questions.
- ✓ Credit Recovery courses are complete courses, aligned to state standards, for which the student will demonstrate mastery before receiving a grade.
- ✓ **Credit recovery is NOT for students who need one-on-one help, or did not get the basic understanding of the course content the first time the course was attempted.**
- ✓ The program is provided free to participating Georgia public high school students for all first time enrollments. For re-enrollments, a fee of \$25 will be assessed and passed on to the students.
- ✓ Students can take up to 2 courses during summer school.

When will this Program Begin?

- ✓ Monday June 6th – Thursday, June 30th
(All MCSD buildings are closed on Friday during the summer months.)
- ✓ Time 8:00 AM – 2:30 PM
- ✓ Place: Shaw High School

- ✓ **Registration letter returned** (completed and signed) by **Tuesday, May 18th** to your child first period teacher or to the office. **We will also register students at Shaw High School on May 25th – 26th from 9:00 AM – 2:00 PM**
- ✓ Daily attendance is required. **Vacations and appointments are not excused.** Students who miss a day will be withdrawn from the course. **(Students can't miss any days of summer school.)**
- ✓ Be punctual—being tardy to class is not permitted.
- ✓ Same rules apply for dress code—no sweats, tank tops, pajamas, or slides.
- ✓ Misbehavior of any kind will not be tolerated. (Unauthorized cell phone use, disrespect, defiance, etc.)
Students who choose to misbehave will be withdrawn from summer school.
- ✓ **In a course that has a Georgia Milestone assessment, the student must take the assessment in order to receive credit for the course; the exam dates are June 27th – 30th.** The GMAS score will be 20% of the course grade. **Students will not receive credit for the course without a GMAS score.**

****Failure to meet all requirements will result in a failing grade and/or withdrawal from the course.****

Credit Recovery Post Test Procedures & Grades

Student success is the most important part of what the Georgia Credit Recovery program strives for in the credit recovery program. To help you master the content of each unit, you must pass each unit post-test with a 70% or better.

The post test is currently set up to allow you three attempts at the post test. After three attempts, you will be temporarily stopped from attempting the test again. If this happens ask the monitor to reset your test. Remember, **all Unit Post Tests must be taken at school under the direct supervision of the credit recovery monitor**, but you may complete unit activities/assignments at home. Only the Post Tests, Essays for English courses, and **Final Exam** will be averaged to determine your final grade in the course. Also, students will be **given only 1 attempt** when writing essays and taking the final exams on the Credit Recovery Program. When writing essays, it is highly recommended that the student review the rubric and the essay requirements before beginning the task.

Please do not forget that the score on the GMAS exam **will count 20%** of the course grade.

Important Information

- ✓ This online credit recovery program is not approved by NCAA for students seeking course credit to be eligible for college/universities under the regulations of the NCAA. **Students receiving credit from this program will NOT be eligible under the NCAA guidelines.**
